The Yellow **DOG** Project is ON so Spread the Word!

On August 27, 2013, volunteers met before the Edmonds City Council Chambers to announce the Saturday August 31st soft launch of the Yellow **DOG** Project. We would like to thank Larry Vogel of MyEdmondsNews.com for provided a "sneak peek" of the project and then provided a very good coverage of names and addresses of supporters.

The Yellow **DOG** Project is a global movement for owners of dogs that need space. It hopes to educate the public and dog owners to identify dogs needing space, promote appropriate contact of dogs and assist dog parents to identify their dog as needing space.

Yellow **DOGS** are dogs who need space - they are not necessarily aggressive dogs but more often are dogs who have issues of fear; pain from recent surgery; are a rescue or shelter dog who has not yet had sufficient training or mastered obedience; are in training for work or service; are in service; or other reasons specific to the dog.

Here's a list of what a Yellow **DOG** is not:

NOT a waiver of responsibility of the owner to train;

NOT an excuse to avoid proper training by the owner; and

NOT an owners' admission of guilt or confession of having a dog that is a handful and needs to continue to experience the world.

If you own a dog that needs more time to warm up to people, situations, or other dogs, simply tie a yellow ribbon on their leash. This ribbon is a signal to the public that the dog needs it's space respected and is a safety measure. The principle here is to EDUCATE enough of the public to know that if a dog has a yellow ribbon tied to their leash, you need to maintain distance from the dog and his/her owner at all times. This allows the dog and his/her owner to get out of the way and go about their business without incident.

On August 27, 2013, volunteers presented a check for \$2,000 to help pay for a fully trained K-9 officer.

A letter to the Editor thanking members of OLAE was published on MyEdmondsNews.com and here are a few excerpts from the letter signed by Police Chief Al Compaan and Police Foundation President David Jones:

“The Edmonds Police Foundation and the Edmonds Police Department extend their heartfelt gratitude to the Off Leash Area Edmonds (OLAE) for the organization’s \$2,000 donation toward purchase of a new K-9 tracking dog. The check was officially presented by OLAE President Julie Nealey to Edmonds Police Foundation President David Jones at the August 27th meeting of the Edmonds City Council.

Among its activities, the Edmonds Police Foundation recently began raising funds to replace “Dash”, one of the Police Department’s tracking dogs that had just retired, by selling small stuffed replica K-9 dogs. Due to OLAE’s donation, and kind donations to the Foundation from many other generous people, funds are now sufficient to purchase the new police dog. The Foundation continues with its efforts to fundraise for acquisition of a new K-9 vehicle, with stuffed dogs still available for purchase.....OLAE promotes responsible users and stewards of the Off Leash Park at Edmonds Marina Beach, raising funds and shepherding volunteers to sustain the park as a valuable asset of the City. As well, OLAE chose to support the Edmonds Police Department’s K-9 Unit with this generous donation.
