PLEASE remember, we DO HAVE a small dog area and that while you may be attentive to your small dog, there are other dog owners that are either training or not as attentive. From our understanding the dog that attacked was a lab-pit-bull mix puppy and the owner of

the small dog was watching their other dog. If you know anything about this, contact the local animal control.

Complaints about not picking up!

We know the summer months are hard for those of us "regulars" – but please, if you see dog poop that is lying around, pick it up. Twice we had to send work crews down to the beach to pick up garbage and the tremendous amount of poop that was found along the fence. REMEMBER – THIS IS YOUR PARK and during the Marina Beach Master Planning, we indicated that it was a CLEAN BEACH as we pick up.

Trick-or-Treating and Dogs

One of the best parts about being a kid and Fall is Halloween. Getting to dress up, going door-to-door and getting candy. Although some people foods are ok *in moderation* this is **never** the case with chocolate. Chocolate can sicken and even kill dogs. It is the most common cause of poisoning in canines.

No amount of chocolate is ever OK for your dog. What makes it poisonous to your pup? Chocolate is made from cocoa and the cocoa bean contains caffeine and a chemical compound called theobromine, which is the real danger. Dogs metabolize this chemical much more slowly than humans. Even small amounts of chocolate can cause vomiting and diarrhea in dogs. Toxic amounts can lead to hyperactivity, tremors, high blood pressure, a rapid heart rate, seizures, respiratory failure and cardiac arrest.
