PITT BULL CASE OVER

Please do not be afraid to take your dogs down to our wonderful off-leash area. The pitt bull case is closed and now a public record. It was classified as a ROUGH PLAY INCIDENT and did not mirror any "rumored incident" that occurred at Magneson Park.

The pitt bull incident at our beach caused two large scratches on the belly of the victim dog. We want to thank a park user for reporting this incident as we hear some incidents go unreported. It might seem odd to call 911 to report a dog incident: but our Animal Control Officers are part of the police department and that is how incidents must be reported. *Do not be afraid to call 911* and most importantly, be civil and kind as it is generally not the dog's fault, it usually is the owners.

Education is the most important key to helping all users understand that their dog may have a problem with a certain dog, it is just that simple.

MEETING OUR ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICERS

The City of Edmonds is lucky to have two of the hardest working police officers who handle animal control, parking and ordinance enforcement. Officer Debbie Dawson has been with the department for 23 years and was a former educator. Officer Tabatha Shoemake, who was at this year's Halloween Howl, has been with the department for over a year and was a former IRS auditor. Recently, O.L.A.E.'s Board Member Diane spent an hour interviewing them.

A mission statement of O.L.A.E. is education. We all know an educated park user understands the importance of keeping the off-leash area clean as that equates to a safe and healthy park and a clean Puget Sound. But keep in mind, dogs are a lot like kids or even adults as sometimes we are totally in agreement with the room and other times, there can be a problem. So, keep this in mind while in the park or when walking your dog. We need to be tuned in to our four-legged friends and watch how they are acting with other dogs. It is unfortunate but, sometimes the perfect dog may not always act perfectly.

Another fascinating fact Diane learned was that over 60 percent of people in the USA have pets. If we use this statistic and think of Edmonds (at 40,000+ people), that would equate to 24,000 citizens with pets. Since we

cannot determine the actual number of dogs as opposed to cats in Edmonds (there is no requirement to license your cat unlike surrounding cities such as Seattle and Mountlake Terrace) we will estimate this number by cutting it in half. So, using a 50% cut, we can estimate that there are about 12,000 people in Edmonds who own a dog. Total licenses issued in 2009 were 2,300! WOW, isn't that alarming! Licenses fees have not changed since 1987 and are only \$5.00 and \$18.00 for a non-neutered dog.

The MAJOR REASON TO HAVE A PET LICENSE IS TO AID IN RETURNING A LOST PET; licenses provide records as to where the pet resides. **For the New Year, think about registering your pet as \$5.00 can bring you peace of mind.** To register, visit the local police department and ask for a pet license. Once your pet is licensed, a renewal notice will automatically be sent to your home each year for your pet.
